4. First-aid Measures

4.1 Description of First Aid Measures

GENERAL NOTES: When symptoms persist or in all cases of doubt seek medical advice.

5.3 Advice for firefighters

Flash back possible over considerable distance. In the event of fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus. Water spray Dry powder Alcohol-resistant foam Carbon dioxide (CO₂). Do not use a solid water stream as it may scatter and spread fire. Hazardous decomposition products formed under fire conditions. Collect contaminated fire extinguishing water separately. INSTRUCTIONS FOR SAFE HANDLING: Take necessary action to avoid static electricity discharge (which might cause ignition of organic vapours). Vapours may form explosive mixtures with air.
